This year (2023), we are excited to be celebrating our 30th anniversary!

We've come a long way and are extremely proud of our growth and our achievements each academic year.

~ We've got a fantastic team of 24 dedicated staff members, and we spread our wings over West Berkshire, Reading, Wokingham, Swindon, Oxford, and Hampshire.

~ We collaborate with over 70 schools, reaching almost 20,000 students through in-school events annually.

~ But that's not all! We've teamed up with more than 900 businesses, and our incredible business volunteers generously contribute 4,500 hours of their time to support us annually.

~ And we organise a whopping 1,800 student work experience placements each year, opening doors to new opportunities.

A message from our CEO:

"The academic year 22/23 was a busy one for us here at EBP. It was the first year in 3 years that our delivery was not affected by COVID, which meant we were fully back out running in person events and workshops in schools and could send students out on work experience placements.

We have continued to grow, impacting over 20,000 students across the Thames Valley area with either in school events or work experience placements. Our work has helped these students gain valuable employability skills, develop their confidence and awareness of their own strengths and potential, as well as informing them about different career paths available. We have worked closely with local businesses to truly meet our mission of "uniting education and business to inspire and equip our future workforce for tomorrow's workplace".

I was delighted and privileged to take on the role of CEO in May, to continue the excellent work done by my predecessor, Michelle Smith, and the team and I'm proud to say that during this time we also celebrated our 30th birthday. This officially fell in June 2023, but we planned our official celebrations to tie in with our largest ever Destinations Careers Expo that took place in October.

I would like to thank everyone who has supported us this year: businesses who have shared their time to volunteer at our events, to host students on work experience and to fund and engage with our programmes, all our funders for their contributions and of course our schools who have worked with us tirelessly to support their students – we couldn't do it without you!



Work Experience Team

Why work experience?

YEUK's Youth Voice Census 2023 established that a lack of work experience is the biggest barrier faced by young people not in work, yet 2/3 of children leave school with no work experience.

(Speakers for Schools, Youth Voice Census Sept 23)

Currently, most are navigating the journey to the world of work, unsure about the skills valued by employers and the route to gaining those skills.









Students who complete work experience on average will raise their future earnings by over £1088 per year and attending work experience reduces the chance of becoming NEET (not in education, employment or training) from 11% to 7%.


Work Experience Team

By the end of the Summer 2023, the work experience team had placed **over 1800 students** in their chosen placement.

This resulted in many success stories, including apprenticeships and part time work being offered, as well as some lucky students having their own work printed at a local publishing company!







Work experience has supported our students to build their confidence, develop soft skills that increase their employability chances and also provides them with valuable additional experiences they can draw on when they come to apply to further education courses, or start to write CV's and apply for work in the future.

Destinations Expo 2022



Careers fairs provide the perfect opportunity for businesses to raise their profile with our future workforce, inform young people about the opportunities within the organisation and showcase the different routes available. These events enable young people to gain invaluable real-life interactions with businesses. They inspire and motivate as well as showing the immense diversity of jobs and career paths available to them.

Destinations Expo is our annual interactive careers fair for Year 11-13 students from West Berkshire and North Hampshire. It is the largest of its type in the area and is a fantastic opportunity for local businesses to source new talent, inspire the future workforce and showcase the benefits of working for an organisation.

Universities and pathway providers are invited from further afield and have the opportunity to engage with up to 1500 students.
