Get Shirty, Monday 22nd June, 08:30–16:15, Year 9

8 volunteers needed

Students will spend the day with business volunteers, developing ideas and producing a comprehensive business plan for an independent t-shirt manufacturing company. The students will produce a detailed portfolio which contains all of their design ideas, packing requirements, promotional material and financial plans as well as design and create a team t-shirt. Students will be guided by EBP staff and volunteers. A full briefing will be given in advance. No prior preparation is required. **Whatever your specialism (mentoring, strategy, finance, marketing, design, etc), you will be well-placed to support these young people.**

Highdown School and Sixth Form Centre, Reading

People Like Me, Wednesday 24th June, 08:30–15:00, Year 9

2 volunteers needed

To help students to identify their skills and strengths and careers best suited to them. In this workshop, students complete a questionnaire which uses their skills and strengths to form a profile of themselves. This profile is then used to identify/suggest the roles/areas within STEM careers that the student would be best suited to. Business Ambassadors from STEM related organisations are needed to complete the questionnaire and share their experience with the students.

Enrichment Day, Thursday 12th February, 09:00–14:45, Year 9–11

Guess My Job Morning with Year 8 & 9:

This is a fun and interactive event where you will be interviewed by a group of students who will try to guess what you do for a living. After student questioning and guessing you will reveal your role and talk about your career journey.

Mixed Activities Afternoon with Year 10 & 11

After an icebreaker activity looking at Growth Mindset, the majority of volunteers will be asked to support students with their Mock Interviews – interviewing the students and sharing your expertise with them in a positive and supportive environment. Other volunteers will be asked to remain in the main room to support with a creative activity which students will be completing when not being interviewed.

Experience of young people with Special Educational Needs is useful but not essential as a full briefing will be given. Ideally, all volunteers will support the whole day to understand the school, but 2 x half-day shifts will be accommodated.

Students will work in a team and put their imagination and engineering skills to the test with Cardboard City! A cardboard city of their own design can become anything they desire. A winning product/service will be chosen from all the teams. Guess My Job: This is a fun event for students to learn about job roles they may not be aware of and to break down stereotypes. Business Volunteers are asked a number of questions by the students, to which they can only answer Yes or No. The students can 'guess their job' in a given time. Volunteers then spend a few more minutes with the students, answering questions in more detail about what they do

Intro to Engineering: The aim of this workshop is to understand how engineers shape our world, by learning the different types of engineering that is available. Business Ambassadors will help students with an interactive problem to solve. Business Volunteers will receive a full briefing prior to the event and a briefing on the morning of the event. No advance preparation is needed.
